


answers, and exploring
complex problems.

Research addresses
the process of
finding answers.



Defined as



a usually large collection of data organized especially for rapid search and retrieval (as by a computer)

Have you ever used a database?

Yes you have!

Search engines like Google, Bing and Yahoo are databases which contain free websites.

Academic databases are provided free to MA schools if the school has a certified librarian. Databases provide free articles from encyclopedias, periodicals, magazines & academic journals as well as media like primary sources, video, audio, images, statistics and infographics expertly curated by information specialists.

Search Engines vs. Databases

Search Engines

- Anyone can create a website
- Info is not always complete, accurate, or credible
- Millions of search results

Databases

- Research has been reviewed by information specialists for accuracy
- May contain copyrighted media that is not free to the public
- Less search results, which can also be filtered
- Contains targeted, complete, accurate & credible information

Additional Library Services


In addition to providing experiences with & access to academic resources, information, ideas, and technology for all learners through databases, the librarian can also assist in:

Academic

- The inquiry process (formulating questions about personal interests or curricular topics)
- The step-by-step research process
- The creation of rubrics for a variety of products that illustrate learning
- Providing opportunities for learners to share learning products and to reflect on the learning process with others using constructive feedback

Vocational

- Career Research
- Researching employers before applying to jobs
- Researching employers to formulate questions before interviewing
- Effective resume writing
- Interview skills
