The **Amelia Bloomer List** is a yearly feminist book recommendations for youth readers created by the ALA's Feminist Task Force's Amelia Bloomer Project.

The **Américas Award** created by the Consortium of Latin American Studies Programs (CLASP), awards authors for English-language or Spanish-language works of fiction, poetry, folklore, or nonfiction...literature that accurately represent Latin America, the Caribbean, or Hispanic/Latino populations living in the United States.

The biennial **American Indian Youth Literature Award** created by the American Indian Library Association honors the very best writing and illustrations by and about American Indians which present American Indians in the fullness of their humanity in the present and past contexts.

The annual **Arab American Book Award** is presented to one children's book and one young adult book to preserve and advance the understanding, knowledge, and resources of the Arab American community.

The **Carter G. Woodson Award** from The National Council for the Social Studies annually awards excellence to social science books depicting ethnicity in the United States.

The **Coretta Scott King Book Awards**, founded in 1969, are given annually to outstanding African American authors and illustrators of books for children and young adults that demonstrate an appreciation of African American culture and universal human values.

The **Dolly Gray Awards** are awarded yearly for children's works of fiction with positive portrayals of people with disabilities.

Founded in 1953, and given annually, the **Jane Addams Children's Book Award** recognizes books that promote peace, social justice, world community, or equality of the sexes and of all races. The award is presented by the Women's International League for Peace and Freedom and the Jane Addams Peace Association.

The **Mildred L. Batchelder Award** founded in 1968, and presented by the Association of Library Service to Children of the American Library Association annually endows a U.S. publisher for the most outstanding book originally published in a language other than English in a country other than the United States.

The **National Jewish Book Award** authors are awarded for works which focus on Jewish themes, including the Children's Literature Award and the Louis Posner Memorial Award for picture books.
